Lucky Seven Round-Robin Steel

A NEW STYLE OF SIDE-BY-SIDE COMPETITION. With a “shooter vs. shooter” match format and no reloads, one must combine speed with accuracy in order to win. Making each shot count; and count faster than the other shooter might be more challenging than it sounds.

Do you feel lucky?

DIVISIONS. There will be two divisions: “Limited” and “Unlimited.” The Limited Division is for any centerfire handgun with open sights. The Unlimited Division is for any centerfire handgun with optical sights and/or compensators or ported barrels. You don’t have to be a seasoned expert shooter. Safe gun handling skill is the primary prerequisite. The matches are for everyone!

STAGES. An array of three steel plates for each shooter plus one final set of overlapping stop plates are placed 13 yards from the firing line. Two shooters will be called to the firing line by number (given at registration), and at the Range Safety Officer’s command, each engage their target array. The first shooter to dispatch their target array and the stop plate is declared the winner.

FORMAT. A “Round Robin” tournament format is utilized. Everyone competes against all shooters in their respective division until accumulating a predetermined number of losses, also known as “outs.” The number of outs is dependent upon the number of entries; never less than three. Many times a shooter is allowed four or more outs before being eliminated from the competition. There will be one declared winner for each division. **NO RELOADS PERMITTED.** Therefore, the shooter with the firearm having the lowest maximum capacity will determine the maximum number of rounds allowed in the other shooter’s firearm. If both shooters fail to dispatch their targets and run out of ammunition, then neither shooter will score an out (a draw) and the next two shooters will be called to the line.

EQUIPMENT. What do I need to compete? Any autoloading pistol or double action revolver that fires centerfire ammunition; .45 ACP, .44 Special, .40, .38 Special, and 9mm are popular. No spare magazines (autos) or speedloaders/moon clips (revolvers) are required.

SAFETY. Eye and ear protection is mandatory. **No magnum ammunition is allowed in accordance with the MPC Range Rules.** There shall be no loaded firearms except on the firing line, and then only upon the Range Officer’s command. Firearms handling is only permitted in designated gun handling areas.
