ELIGIBILITY: NRA Rule 2.4, ***NRA MEMBERSHIP SUGGESTED BUT NOT REQUIRED.***

RULES: Current NRA Police Pistol Combat Rules (2009) with 2011 updates shall govern.

REGISTRATION: Advanced entries are requested by USPS, e/mail, or phone **CLASSIFICATIONS.**

Deposit is not required for advance entry. Acknowledgement of entry will only be sent if E/mail address or self-addressed stamped envelope is provided.

COMPETITORS' DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: Rule 18.1 - 18.15

ENTRIES CLOSE: No closing date. Entries accepted to capacity of the range. Pre registration is strongly suggested if you want to shoot on your choice of relays/days. Each relay limited to 16 shooters.

MAKE CHECKS PAYABLE TO: THE MARYLAND POLICE COMBAT ASSOCIATION

CLASSIFICATIONS: Current NRA Police Pistol Combat classifications (High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, Marksman, and Classified) will be used in this match. Competitors who do not have a current Police Pistol Classification, or an assigned/temporary classification **must** compete in the **High Master Class** (Rule 19.2)

TEAMS: Will be unfired team matches. No competitor may fire on more than one team in any match. No competitor may fire in both a 4-Officer and a 2-Officer team match with the revolver or semi-automatic pistol (Rule 2.10). Scores will be taken from Match 5 of the respective 1500 Match. All members must be from the same agency or department and firing the same type of firearm (revolver or semi-auto pistol). Awards will be given for revolver and semi-auto teams.

SQUADDING: Each relay is limited to 16 shooters. Competitors will fire the entire 1500 match before leaving the line. Ample time will be allowed to change equipment between matches.

TARGETS: Rule 4.1- NRA OFFICIAL B-27 on Paper-Turning Targets.

ARMS, AMMUNITION, AND HOLSTERS: Current NRA rules (2009) with 2011 updates will apply. Any questions concerning firearms, ammunition, equipment, or holsters should be directed to the NRA referee or match director prior to commencement of that shooter's relay. Where applicable, triggers will be weighed and ammunition inspected prior to match.

SCORING: Scoring will be done by competitors on the line at the conclusion of each match. **PASS RIGHT - SCORE LEFT.**

CHALLENGES: There will be a \$3.00 fee to challenge the scoring of any target which will be returned to the competitor if the challenge is upheld. Challenges will be decided by the official NRA referee or three-person jury.

AWARDS: Cash and trophies - A competitor will be given only one award in any one match. There will be no category awards, and classes will be combined upwards if the number of competitors in a given classification is less than FIVE.

Revolver and Semi-Auto will be separated for awards.

State Champion will be the Maryland resident with the highest score in EITHER Revolver OR Semi-Auto 1500 Match.

COURSES OF FIRE: In all matches, time starts with a loaded gun in the holster and includes time to reload. Matches designated as double action, must be fired double action. Matches designated as single action, may be fired either single or double action.

MATCH 1 - STANDING WITHOUT SUPPORT POSITION AT 7 & 15 YARDS.

Match 1 is fired in two stages of 12 shots each, double action, standing without support position. The first stage is fired at 7 yards and the second stage is fired at 15 yards. Time allowed is 20 seconds per stage.

MATCH 2 - KNEELING AND STANDING COURSE AT 25 YARDS

Match 2 consists of 6 shots kneeling without the use of the barricade; 6 shots standing left-handed from behind the left side barricade; and 6 shots standing right-handed from behind the right barricade. All firing is double action from 25 yards. Time allowed is 90 seconds.

MATCH 3 - SITTING, PRONE AND STANDING COURSE AT 50 YARDS

Match 3 consists of 6 shots fired sitting; 6 shots fired prone; 6 shots standing fired with the left hand using the left barricade; and 6 shots standing fired right hand using the right barricade. Firing may be single or double action from 50 yards. Time allowed is 2 minutes and 45 seconds.

MATCH 4 - STANDING WITHOUT SUPPORT POSITION COURSE - 25 YARDS

Match 4 consists of two stages of 12 shots each, fired double action from a standing without support position at 25 yards. Time allowed is 35 seconds per stage.

MATCH 5 - NRA NATIONAL POLICE COURSE

THE NRA NATIONAL POLICE COURSE CONSISTS OF 60 SHOTS FIRED IN 4 STAGES AS FOLLOWS:

STAGE A - 7 yards; 12 shots fired double action standing without support in a time limit of 20 seconds.

STAGE B - 25 yards; 18 shots fired double action. 6 shots kneeling, 6 shots standing left hand from behind left barricade, 6 shots standing right hand from behind right barricade. Time limit of 90 seconds.

STAGE C - 50 yards; 24 shots fired single or double action. 6 shots sitting, 6 shots prone, 6 shots standing left hand from behind left barricade, 6 shots standing right hand from behind right barricade. Time limit is 2 minutes and 45 seconds.

STAGE D - 25 yards; 6 shots fired double action from the standing without support position in a time limit of 12 seconds.

MATCH 6 (UNFIRED) - AGGREGATE OF MATCHES 1 THROUGH 5

MATCH 7 (UNFIRED) - THE TWO OFFICER TEAM MATCH - NATIONAL POLICE COURSE

MATCH 8 (UNFIRED) - THE FOUR OFFICER TEAM MATCH - NATIONAL POLICE COURSE

MATCH 9 – REVOLVER DISTINGUISHED MATCH - NATIONAL POLICE COURSE

MATCH 10 – SEMI-AUTOMATIC PISTOL DISTINGUISHED MATCH - NATIONAL POLICE COURSE

GOVERNOR’S TWENTY ELIGIBILITY: The Maryland Governor’s Twenty is an award sanctioned by the NRA and presented by the Maryland Police Combat Association. It is awarded to the top 50% of eligible competitors (maximum 20 awards) based on standings at the end of the shooting year. To be considered for this award, the competitor must be a full time (or retired) law enforcement officer as specified in NRA Rule 2.4. They must reside in Maryland and fire in at least one 1500 Match (Matches 1-5) sponsored by the Maryland Police Combat Association during the calendar year. The highest score fired in any one 1500 Match in Maryland will decide the standing of the Maryland Governor’s Twenty.

DIRECTIONS TO THE RANGE:

(FREDERICK, MD)- The Monocacy Pistol Club is located at 6432 Plant Rd. Frederick, MD 21701. This is adjacent to the Frederick City Police Range and the Linganore Rifle Range off Linganore Rd. approximately 3 miles east of Frederick, Md.

FROM THE EAST: (Baltimore area) Take Rt. I-70 west to Rt. 144 (Exit 59). Go west on Rt. 144 (old Rt. 40) To Linganore Rd. Go North on Linganore Rd. approximately one mile to a paved road on the right marked 'Plant Rd.' Make a right and go over the hill to the third range (metal gate on the left at the bottom of the hill.)

FROM THE WEST: (Frederick area) Go east on Rt. I-70 to Rt. 144 (Exit 56). Go east on Rt. 144 to Linganore Rd. Go north on Linganore Rd. approximately one mile to a paved road on the right marked 'Plant Rd.' Make a right and go over the hill to the third range (metal gate on the left at the bottom of the hill).
