

MPC STEEL RULES

COMPETITION DIVISIONS

- Stock revolver: No comps, no external weights, no porting, no optics/scopes. If you are unsure, ask the match director.
- Stock auto: No comps, no porting, no optics/scopes. Nothing but a stock firearm. If you are unsure ask the match director.
- Open auto: No restrictions on gun modifications including but not limited to, types of sights, barrel porting, grips, compensators, barrel weights etc, providing that any such equipment does not render the firearm unsafe in the opinion of the match official.
- Open revolver: As above, the same rules apply. If you have a question as to the division for your firearm, ask the match official.

COMPETITION RULES

Start Position: Shooters may shoot from a holster or from the ready position. If a holster is used the shooter must show he or she is proficient in drawing a Firearm. The shooter will start in the surrender position, which is defined as Hands held shoulder high with wrists visible from behind by the ranger officer/squad leader. Ready position is defined as being ready to start with the firearm pointed down approximately on a 40° angle away from the body.

ALL FIREARMS REMAIN UNLOADED, HOLSTERED OR IN A BAG UNTIL THE RANGE OFFICAL GIVES PERMISSION TO HANDLE AND LOAD.

HOLSTERS:

Any safe holster as so deemed by match officials is allowed, providing that it is Securely mounted on a waist belt and does not allow the shooter's finger to engage the trigger when in the holster. Breakfront, clamshell, cross draw and shoulder holsters are Specifically prohibited from use for safety reasons. Any holster rig must allow the muzzle of the shooter's gun to remain pointed in a safe direction (i.e. downrange towards the targets) AT ALL TIMES throughout the draw sequence, from start until targets are engaged.

AMMUNITION:

Center-fire ammunition, lead, semi-jacketed, copper-clad are recommended.

A MAXIMUM VELOCITY OF 1350 fps WILL BE IN EFFECT.

Use of steel jacketed or steel core, Magnum rounds or high penetration ammo is expressly prohibited. A chronograph check may be made to qualify a shooter's ammo. You can be disqualified for using non-conforming ammo on M P C ranges.

HOLSTER DRAW SAFETY CHECK:

New shooters or members must be able to demonstrate prior experience speed drawing a handgun from a holster by submitting to a safety check prior to starting their first match. IPSC or NRA Action Pistol shooters possessing a current classification card must present their card to be exempt from the safety check. The safety check will determine if the shooter has basic proficiency in performing a competition holster draw, including safe gun handling knowledge and ability. Match officials will be responsible for performing this check and will make the final determination of whether or not to allow the shooter to compete. The "Drawing from the Holster Checklist" form will be used when conducting this safety check. The Chief Range Safety Officer (CRSO) will maintain this form on file.

SEMI-AUTOS

"1911" semi-auto will be cocked and locked (safety on) until out of the holster/or up from the ready position prepared to engage targets. Non 1911 Semi-autos will be cocked and the safety off BUT THE FINGER WILL NOT BE PLACED ON THE TRIGGER OR INSERTED IN THE TRIGGER GUARD UNTIL FIREARM IS POINTED DOWN RANGE ENGAGING TARGETS. Shooters shooting GLOCKS must keep their finger OUT of the trigger guard until ready to engage targets. When shooting Speed Steel the SAFETY MUST BE ON FOR MAGAZINE CHANGE.

REVOLVERS

Revolvers will be loaded, hammer down, trigger not engaged until shooter is ready to engage targets.

FIRING LINE SEQUENCE

The range official will call the name of the next shooter, who may enter the box/or line with his or her gear and begin preparation, BUT MAY NOT HANDLE ANY GUNS. The range official will then tell the shooter, "YOU MAY LOAD". After an appropriate amount of time the Range official will say "SHOOTER READY, (slight pause) STANDBY". The next sound will be the starting buzzer. At the SOUND OF THE BUZZER and NOT BEFORE the shooter may Draw / aim and engage targets.

RESTARTS

A restart may be called for if the shooter has not fired a shot or at the discretion of the official when there is a malfunction.

EARLY STARTS

The official will yell STOP.... the shooter must freeze in position and listen for the next command from the official, which would normally be make the firearm safe, re-holster etc..... The shooter will be warned for the first infraction and a “W” will be placed on the score sheet next to that run. Any succeeding infractions during the course of fire the shooter will be assessed a penalty as outlined in the TIME PENALTIES.

SCORING

The timing device will determine time scoring.

TIME PENALTIES

EARLY STARTS: plus (5) seconds
MISSED PLATE: (other than the stop plate) plus (5) seconds
MISSED STOP PLATE: plus thirty (30) seconds
DID NOT FINISH: (DNF) plus thirty (30) seconds
MAXIMUM RUN TIME: will be thirty (30)

TARGET SCORING

The range officer is initially responsible to determine whether or not all plates were hit. If there is doubt he may ask the scorer, who should be watching as well, for assistance in this determination. The shooter has the responsibility to ask the range official for a hit check if in doubt. At that time the official will examine the plates and make that determination.

CLASSIFICATIONS

A Class	80% to 100%
B Class	60% to 79%
C Class	0% to 59%
